Track Rules



for visitors to the VELTINS EisArena Winterberg

The following track rules should be observed at all times so that safety and order is ensured in the VELTINS EisArena areal and training and competition can be take place in an unimpeded manner.

General basic rules

The VELTINS EisArena is a venue where training and competition take place. It is designed for national and international events. Visitors to the track and sports enthusiasts are welcome. However, for your own safety and to ensure that the pursuit of sports can take place safely, and because the pursuit of sports and the sports facility in itself pose a risk to life and limb, certain rules of behaviour have to be adhered to.

Rules of behaviour

Since ice and the danger of slipping are to be reckoned with depending on the weather conditions, the track area is only to be entered wearing suitable footwear.

For your own safety and to ensure that training and competition can take place in an unhindered manner, the instructions of the track staff and especially the track announcer are to be followed at all times.

It is strictly prohibited to enter the track or to perform track inspections. Such actions are only permitted with the approval of a person in charge at the VELTINS EisArena.

The following are not prohibited:

- Accessing the track, starting bays, bends, turns and transitions
- Throwing objects onto or across the track
- Entering restricted areas
- Taking flash photos
- Leaning over the track

Considerate behaviour needs to be assured at all times to provide unobstructed passage for rescue, relief and service vehicles.

It is prohibited to access the cooling lines, cable channels and track gangways. Dogs are to be kept on a lead.

Each visitor consents irrevocably and indefinitely to the free use of the image and/or sound of his/her person recorded in connection with an event for all forms of audio-visual media, and, in particular, for live transmissions, broadcasts and/or recordings.

Instructions given by the control and marshalling services and markings and signs are to be followed at all times. Motor vehicles are only to be parked in areas marked or allocated for parking. The regulations of the German Highway Code (StVO) apply in all other cases.

Liability

The Track Operator is liable for material damage incurred by the visitor only as far as it is based on an intentional or grossly negligent breach of duty by the Track Operator, or his vicarious agents or representatives. This does not apply if the damage that occurred can be attributed to the breach of an obligation incumbent upon the Track Operator, the fulfilment of which makes the visit to the track areal possible in the first place and on which the visitor can regularly rely.

The Track Operator is not liable for damages incurred by third parties due to the manner in which visitors behave. The visitor indemnifies the Track Operator against all claims made by third parties that derive from his personal behaviour.
